# mutual appreciation ideas

The following list offers some simple ways for teachers and pastors to appreciate each other. Small things can go a long way in strengthening the ministry partnership.

### swag

Give each other stuff. (Teachers...if you have stuff with the school logo on it, make sure the pastor has two of each—one for him/her and one to give away. Pastors... donuts, flowers, a Tim's card...let teachers know you're thinking about them!)

# honour

Say "thank you" publicly. (Teachers and Pastors...praise your pastor in front of students and parents as a partner in ministry.)

Publish special thanks. (Teachers...name the pastor in your newsletter, acknowledging his contribution to your school. Pastors...include special thanks to individual teachers in the church bulletin, acknowledging their work.)

# support

Show support for both school and church programs. (Be on time for board meetings, visit all constituent churches, follow through on commitments, offer public verbal support)

Don't believe everything you hear. (When others criticize your partner in ministry, give your partners the benefit of the doubt and never publicly criticize them.)

#### invite

Look for regular opportunities to invite each other to programs. (Teachers...personally invite or ask students to invite the pastor to specific school programs. Pastors...invite teachers to church programs without the expectation of additional work on their part.)

#### connect

Be intentional about connecting. (Teachers... consider having classes "adopt a pastor", sending encouraging notes and praying daily for him/her. Pastor...schedule regular times to be at the school, to play with kids at recess, to have worship, to offer baptismal classes, etc)

### listen

Listen to each other without judgement. Do what you can to support each other in the challenges you face. Follow through on any promises to help

# communicate well

Maintain a strong and consistent information flow. Eliminate surprises in areas like finance, board actions, community concerns.

Don't take anything for granted; if you have a question or concern, share it clearly and kindly. (Teachers and Pastors...don't wait for big concerns to communicate. Share the small things and the good things first.)

Communicate in several ways: cards, email, phone, text, social media . . . whatever works best for both of you.

#### serve

Find ways to share your talents. (Teachers... look for ways that students can serve the church: cleanup days, service days, etc. Pastors...involve students in the church service, for music, scripture, etc.)

#### collaborate

Ask each other for advice. (Teachers...ask your pastor for a book recommendation on a Bible topic you're preparing. Pastors... ask teachers for ideas on including children or youth in the church service.)

Work together to promote Adventist education, especially on Education Sabbath.

#### pray

Pray for each other, every day in your own devotions, and together as often as you can. Encourage those in your circle of influence to pray, too. (Teachers...encourage students and teachers to pray for your pastors. Pastors... encourage church members to pray for their school, the teachers, and students.)
